The intent was to focus on the concerns that policymakers in government and the private sector might have, so much of the discussion involved questions of law and how the current legal regime helps to define the boundaries of what is or is not acceptable conduct on electronic networks. Background materials on technology, legal underpinnings, and the current policy environment are incorporated into chapters 1 through 3. Chapters 4 through 7 are devoted primarily to discussions of free speech, electronic vandalism, intellectual property interests, and privacy. Chapter 8 focuses on the deliberations of the steering committee. Five appendices provide information about network technology, the agendas for the workshop and forum, and biographies of the steering committee. (MAS)
